## **Energy-Efficient and Highly Intelligent:** COSCO Shipping Universe

Delivered in June 2018, the *COSCO Shipping Universe* stands as a testament to modern shipbuilding excellence, boasting a remarkable container capacity of 21,237 TEU. This vessel, recognised as the world's largest container ship at the time, incorporates energy efficiency, environmental sustainability, and cutting-edge technology.

## Named After Hong Kong's City Flower: OOCL Bauhinia

The OOCL Bauhinia, named in honour of Hong Kong's city flower, symbolises the important connection between the city and shipping. Officially named in December 2024, this ship features an eco-friendly design and state-of-the-art smart technology, with a capacity of 16,828 TEU. It ranks among the largest ships specially designed to navigate the new locks of the Panama Canal, enhancing operational flexibility while setting new standards for energy efficiency and safety.

#### A Meaningful Donation for the HKMM


